


uring the month of March, your PTA plans to introduce the students and staff to something new. A way of acknowledging and making public small acts of

Foundation House Bothell Fieldtrip a Sweet Success




n Friday, **February** 7th, we had 55 students and lots of parents join us to help with our special Valentine's delivery to Foundation House Bothell. Senior

If so, Classic Books is for you! Meetings will start April 7th.

Permission slips went home with all third through sixth grade students in their

February 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday Envelope. **The permission slips must be returned by February 28**<sup>th</sup> to participate in the program.

Classic Books is a free, PTA-sponsored program, designed to encourage children to read and to enrich that reading experience through a discussion with peers and adults.

Beginning April 7th, small groups of students will meet once every 2 weeks to talk about the books they have been assigned to read. Meetings will take place during lunchtime (and up to 15 minutes of lunch recess).

This year, students will be assigned 4 different books to read over an 8 week period. You can turn this great program into a family event as parents are welcome and even encouraged to read the books with their child! Books are chosen for their literary value and are grade level appropriate.

During the bi-weekly meetings, students will have a chance to develop their ideas, exchange opinions, and further explore each story. Two adult co-leaders will help them dive below the surface-level of the text, engaging with the book and each other.
